EFFECTIVE IMMEDIATELY THIS 18TH DAY OF MARCH 2020.

EXECUTED IN ACCORDANCE WITH TEMAGAMI FIRST NATION BCR#2020-04 BASED ON PROVISIONS PROVIDED IN THE DOREEN POTTS HEALTH CENTRE COMMUNICABLE DISEASE AND MANAGEMENT PLAN IN RESPONSE TO THE COVID-19 GLOBAL PANDEMIC. TEMAGAMI FIRST NATION CHIEF & COUNCIL ENACTED THE FIRST NATION CONTROL GROUP (FNCG) INCLUDING THE IMPLEMENTATION OF THE EMERGENCY OPERATIONS CENTRE FOR THE COMMUNITY OF BEAR ISLAND.

TEMAGAMI FIRST NATION DECLARES A STATE OF EMERGENCY

The Temagami First Nation (TFN) hereby declares a Level 3 State of Emergency for the community of Bear Island Reserve due to the ongoing COVID-19 Pandemic with knowledge that at present, there are no known cases within the community.

In accordance with the Temagami First Nation Emergency Response Plan, TFN Chief and Council will coordinate efforts and call upon external resources, as necessary, to protect the health, safety, and well-being of our community.

In response to the declared state of emergency, an Emergency Operations Center (EOC) has been activated the Minowaabandan-gamiing Maawanjihidiwining, *the Lakeview Gathering Place*. Contact information is noted above.

The Coronavirus has yet to be adequately contained. National, Provincial and local health officials have encouraged measures including COVID-19 mitigation, response plans, and declaration of public health emergencies.

The Temagami First Nation Council states, "It is necessary for Chief & Council to declare a State of Emergency Level 3 in the community of Bear Island in response to the Covid-19 Global Pandemic as this initiates the provisions in the Communicable Disease and Management Plan and the implementation of the First Nation Control Group (FNCG) to implement provisions in the Emergency Plan. This will allow TFN staff the time they need to prepare and carry out TFN essential services required during this time of emergency for the health & wellbeing of our community. The Bear Island community have always come together and prevailed through difficult times – we encourage all to continue in strength, kindness and compassion as we all endure this time together."

Council further states, "With the unprecedented global COVID-19 Pandemic upon us, we want to reassure community members that Temagami First Nation's Emergency Operations Committee is active and is reliant upon our health and emergency response professionals; everyone is working together to ensure the ongoing health and safety for all. The situation is rapidly changing on a daily basis and we encourage community members to stay informed of developments by visiting our website and to follow all precautionary steps that are being provided."

The community is being asked to practice social distancing; we remind our people to keep communicating. Connecting in alternative ways in order to maintain physical, mental, spiritual and emotional well-being is essential.

Chief & Council declared a State of Emergency for the Community of Bear Island, in an effort to mitigate the potential spread of COVID-19 as of Wednesday, March 18, 2020.

Attached to this information package; you will find memos from various departments explaining the essential services they will be providing during this time and the status of offices:

Doreen Potts Health Centre; Family Healing & Wellness Centre; Community Support Services; Community Infrastructure & Public Works; Bear Island Public Library; TFN Administration (Finance, Governance, Human Resources, Communications). More information from other departments will be available once received.

Temagami First Nation Chief & Council has enacted the TFN Emergency Control Group and the Operations Centre (located at Minowaabandan-gamiing Maawanjihidiwining Hall). Staff have been redirected and appointed to the Control Group; they are responsible to meet the emergency needs as they arise and to keep information flowing to community members.

All offices have been closed to the public; all unnecessary travel has ceased and departments are ensuring essential services are made available to our community for the health and wellbeing of all. Health & Safety protocols are being implemented and community residents are requested to call ahead to schedule an appointment prior to visiting the facilities. Some essential staff include: OW Worker; Community Health Nurse; Health Services Manager; Office Manager; Interim Social Services Supervisor; Education Manager and members of Administration).

This closure is to ensure that we are not contributing to the spread of the virus and we ask the community to continue to practice the preventative measures; stay home if sick or have any symptoms; continue social distancing practices; enhance cleaning of frequently touched surfaces; no non-essential travel and gatherings; self-isolate for 14 days if symptoms emerge and call a health professional. Do however; get fresh air/go for a walk; watch for news bulletins and community updates; spend quality time with family; check on your neighbors, family and friends with a simple phone call but most of all, stay healthy, stay safe.

More information will be forthcoming; daily updates will be made available on the TFN Website, TFN Facebook page and community notices will be available by mail on Tuesdays and Fridays.

RE: Health Services – COVID-19

Dear Community Residents,

Please be advised, as a result of the Temagami First Nations Chief and Council declaring a Level 3 State of Emergency around COVID 19 in the community, the following DPHC Health Services will be affected:

1. The DPHC building is closed to the public as of Friday, March 20, 2020 until further notice.
2. Regular Medical Transportation Services will cease until further notice beginning Monday, March 23, 2020.
3. After hours Medical Transport continues to be shut down until further notice.
4. Shopping trips will no longer be provided clients. The Temagami First Nation Control Group is in the process of establishing an on-island center for supplies and food stores to be available for the community.
5. To receive services, clients are asked to call the DPHC ahead of time and to arrange an appointment. This is to ensure staff are prepared and access to the building remains controlled. This includes OW, NNADAP and other similar services.
6. All non-essential services have been suspended until further notice, this includes massage therapy and foot care services.

Prescriptions: As a precautionary method, we ask that you stock up on your medications until open water. Prescription pick up service is not guaranteed once regular Medical Transport services cease. If you need assistance in arranging this service, please contact the Medical/Health Administrator of the FNCG to make arrangements.

Home and Community Care: only essential services will be provided during the State of Emergency. This includes:

- garbage pick-up and snow removal;
- Shuttle and in-home services are cancelled until further notice as well.

RE: Infrastructure Department Services – COVID-19

In response to the Declaration of the State of Emergency here in the community in regarding the COVID-19 virus, the Temagami First Nation Infrastructure Department is taking a number of steps to keep residents and workers safe and informed.

The Infrastructure Department is restricting its services to essential services only. Essential services are considered those services that if interrupted would endanger the life, health or personal safety of the residents on Bear Island.

- Home repairs will be on an emergency need only.
 - Prior to any TFN staff entering homes we will be conducting a health screening checklist. Should you be screened and determined that there may be a risk to staff of contracting the COVID-19 virus, staff may refuse to enter or don all appropriate personal protective equipment to complete the service. This will be determined on a case-by-case basis using the screening tool.

The **Department will maintain** the ice road (for as long as we can/weather permitting) and on island road maintenance, garbage and recycling. The daily checks and weekly water testing from the Water Treatment Plant will still continue.
