

WE HAVE CREATED A DRAFT LAND USE PLAN FOR BEAR ISLAND!

WHY ARE WE PREPARING A LAND USE PLAN?

On June 24, 2017, TFN voted to ratify the Temagami First Nation Land Code. A Land Use Plan is one of the documents required under Land Code.

In October 2018, Temagami First Nation/Teme-Augama Anishnabai started the process of developing a Land Use Plan for Bear Island and the Proposed Settlement Lands.

WHAT IS LAND USE PLANNING?

A Land Use Plan is a document containing maps and text that describe how we will **use land in the future**, and the long term **goals and vision** of **Temagami First Nation**.

Without a land use plan there is a higher likelihood that land use conflicts arise, such as building housing on lands that contain environmental features that should be protected.

SUMMARY OF COMMUNITY PRIORITIES

- Protect and enhance shores of Lake Temagami and surrounding lake system
- Development must protect critical habitat areas
- High potential for **undocumented archeological sites** requiring protection
- Economic development and employment for members on Bear Island and the Proposed Settlement Lands is important
- Current housing shortage on Bear Island
- Servicing may be a challenge if development is not located on the loop
- Environmental constraints from the **old landfill** and **quarry** may result in limited developmental potential around those areas
- Bear Island has limited development capacity
- Strong support for a New Community Site on the mainland
- Community togetherness is important









DRAFT LAND USE PLAN FOR BEAR ISLAND

We created a Draft Land Use Plan for Bear Island! Below are some of the highlights.

OUR GUIDING PRINCIPLES:

- Respect for n'Daki Menan, the Land,
 Environment and all the Inhabitants;
- Integrity and Accountability;
- Anishnabai Tradition and Culture;
- Due Diligence; and,
- Knowledge passed down from ancestors.

OUR VISION FOR OUR LANDS:

"Honouring our ancestors and future generations, our land use reflects Anishnabai values and responsibilities to n'Daki Menan."

A Land Use Plan consists of land use designations and policies. We have created land use designations and assigned them to Bear Island. These designations regulate the types of use allowed in an area and are based on current land uses, our planning context, and community priorities. Policies are similar to rules and guide how development should take place in those areas.
